

<u>Field Studies Program (FSP)</u>: (Phase 0 – Conflict Prevention) Broadly expose IMS to specific facets of the United States, its people, political system, military, institutions and way of life; manage the sponsorship of IMS through Fort Leavenworth and Civilian Sponsor organizations.

<u>Academics</u>: Prep Course, FSP and IMS focused electives managed by the Field Studies Program and Director IMSD assist IMS in developing expertise and skill sets necessary for the effective management of their national forces independently and in conjunction with US military forces.

- 289 graduates in the International Hall of Fame from 77 countries....





# **ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS**



- IMSD, as the IMSO of record on Fort Leavenworth serves as the administrative lead for all IMS, regardless of country of origin, for USG purposes.
- In this role IMSD is charged with supporting IMS and their Authorized Dependents, while acting as a compliance agent for the US Army and the USG.
- Lines of communication, reporting requirements, etc. are fixed in regulatory policy.
- SIGNIFICANT & IMPACTFUL CHANGES IN IMS ADMIN post December 2019 (NAS Pensacola): No CAC Card; No Escort Privileges; Installation Access limited to training location ONLY; Reporting requirements on both official and leisure travel





# Summer "Flow" 2023-2024 IMS/Issues

- <u>Surge limitations</u> ID card appointments/related Admin first priority is to IMS; then Authorized Dependents
- IMSD intent is to allow <u>IMS to move to permanent housing as soon as</u> <u>available</u>
- Intent is to manage admin appointments to support
- Housing availability dates NOT controlled by IMSD; furnishing offerings are limited by private company ability to support (we anticipate >/= 70 IMS living on post – and ~ 10 deliveries per day)

# FIELD STUDIES PROGRAM (Sponsor Imperatives)



- Your ability to collaborate/coordinate with your IMS & Sponsor Team Early (FLW/IO/KCP2P) is CRITICAL
- Choose one of three major sponsor events (SFF, HDD, FFF) with your Sponsor Team and know your +1
- Consider Breaks/Holidays (Long Wknds, Spring Break, Religious & National Holidays) as Opt-in Events
- Include IMS (when possible) in normal life & family events
- Desired Minimum Contact with IMS is Monthly-Weekly is an A+. U and IMS choose frequency/format
- Always have a back-up Sponsor for events/activities...be prepared to be the back-up ;)
- What's the Cost? Always take into consideration Customs, Culture and Capability of IMS and your family
- Never be taken advantage of as a Sponsor-Don't feel compelled to support too much (\$\$, Time, Stuff)
- Be recognized for your service...1,5,10,15,20,25,30 Yrs and Beyond-make sure we know if you are due!
- It's a Human Endeavor-not all will mesh well, don't get frustrated, and have expectation management
- Make lifelong Family Friends but know its always personality dependent- Above All-HAVE Some FUN!
