Her story remained untold until her books were published, *PEARL HARBOR CHILD*, followed by *PEARL HARBOR WARRIORS*. Her third book, *REMEMBER WORLD WAR II, Kids Who Survived Tell Their Stories*, was published by National Geographic. In this book, Dorinda captures not only WWII history, but shares resilient and courageous stories seldom told, those of the children of war. She believes it is her mission to bring WWII history to the classroom and is a frequent speaker at schools.

She recently retired as a Marriage and Family psychotherapist, and is enjoying serving on the Red Cross Mental Health disaster team, as the Hawaii Ethnic Enrichment Commissioner, a Raytown Human Relations Council member, and on the board of the Missouri Humanities Council. After retirement, she planned to catch up on neglected house chores, instead she found speaking on cruise ships way more fun.

Professional photographer husband, Larry, and Dorinda live in Raytown and are the parents of four adult sons, and have 13 gorgeous, brilliant grandchildren.
