## A Message from the Chapter President

Dear GKCPTP members:



I hope you and your loved ones are doing well. The pandemic of COVID-19 seems to be getting worse in some states as time is passing by. Let's pray for the safety of our nation and the newly arrived international military students.

As you know the officers you are sponsoring have already arrived at Fort Leavenworth. They are completing their mandatory 14-day quarantine period and it will be over soon. I spoke with a couple of officers and their emotions are mixed. They are

anxiously waiting to meet with their sponsors, see their classmates and drive around the city. They are going through a very tough time, living alone, without their families and not knowing anyone around them. Muslim officers spent their Eid Al Adha by themselves away from their families and friends. This Eid, called Eid A Adha 'Feast of the Sacrifice', is the last of the two Islamic holidays celebrated worldwide each year and considered the holier of the two. It honors the willingness of Prophet Abraham to sacrifice his son as an act of obedience to God's command.

I believe you are also as excited as the officers are to meet. This year our job as sponsors brings additional challenges due to the pandemic. Please keep in mind that we all volunteer to serve this country in the best possible way as citizen ambassadors. I ask each sponsor to make an earnest effort to make their officer's time at CGSC as positive an experience as possible during these unusual circumstances we're living in. ## Initial Contact with Your Class of 2021 Student

We have an update from Jim Fain:

- Coordinated physical contact between sponsors and international military students is permitted beginning the morning of **August 8** (except the IMS from Canada - who is quarantined due to late arrival through the morning of August 14).
- **IMPORTANT:** Please first ask your student if he or she has anything already scheduled, especially with IMSD (International Military Student Division). For example, it is very important for many students to complete the English Comprehension Level (ECL) program. The best approach is to explicitly ask the student to ensure they don't have anything scheduled. We cannot afford to have IMS miss something, and when we track them down have them say, "Well, my sponsor wanted to take me to do X,Y or Z and I didn't want to miss that opportunity."

## Status of Dependents

We had previously communicated that a decision would be made on dependents that might accompany students. Jim Fain strongly recommends the continued deferral of dependents until pandemic-related conditions improve. For officers that accept the risk and decide to bring dependents, the attached describes the conditions they must accept.
